In order to meet the needs of foreign markets where it operates, the company purchased a new dried meat slicing machine, a new dried meat packaging machine and a new fresh meat packaging machine. The new machines are fully compliant with relevant EU Directives, they improve the company's competitiveness in the international markets and at the same time vastly improve the health and safety of workers.

The company received free technical assistance to optimize its investment project and 15% grant cash-back after the successful project verification, funded by the European Union.
